Nathan's Notes...

As we continue to talk about common roadblocks in our service for Christ, we should really address one that everyone deals with at some point: failure. Nothing takes the wind out of your sails like expending effort in some great endeavor and then finding that it did not accomplish what you hoped. The reason failure is such a roadblock is because of how it robs us of future service. Once we've experienced it's pain, we can become less motivated and more uncertain in subsequent service opportunities. It can be an open door to let fear take over and prevent us from even trying again.

Today we will be studying a story from the life of the prophet Elijah. After winning a "contest" against the prophets of Baal, Elijah receives an outcome that he doesn't expect. What follows is his struggle with depression, defeat, and his own expectations. But he soon finds that God is bigger than all of these things.
