If you'd like to help out, please let the office or one of the elders know.


Camp Allendale Service Days-

Nathan's Notes...

Happy Palm Sunday! This is the day that Christians remember Jesus' arrival at Jerusalem before His crucifixion. What seems odd to me about this day is that it is a mixture of both celebration and mourning. When Jesus first approached Jerusalem, His followers met Him with shouts of praise and celebration. They laid their cloaks on the road in front of Him and cut and waved palm branches (hence the name "Palm Sunday"). They were excited because they correctly believed that the Savior from God had arrived. But hindsight is 20/20. For this reason, Palm Sunday has always had a hint of sadness about it for me. For although Jesus was first met with joy by His disciples, by the end of the week, He was being mocked with detestation by His opponents.

In our passage today, we see a hint of both happening. Jesus rides to Jerusalem on a young donkey, surrounded by shouts of praise to God. But as He approaches the city, He begins weeping because of what He knows will happen. He is not weeping for His own loss of life, but for the rebellion of the city as a whole. It's in the midst of all of this that He utters a confusing phrase about rocks crying out. Today, we'll look at these events in more detail and be reminded of our mission as His people
